MLA (8th Edition, 2016) Style Citations

In the text of your paper you acknowledge the sources you used with a brief parenthetical citation that refers to an alphabetical Works Cited list at the end of the paper. The brief citation should include just enough information for a reader to find the full citation in the list as well as a page number, if appropriate. For example, if you are citing a fact found on page 359 of *Up from History* by Robert J. Norrell, the brief citation might be (Norrell 359); it might be (Norrell *Up* 359) if your list contains two books by Norrell. If you mention the author by name, you may need just need the page number (359).

Formatting the Works Cited list (pp. 20-53 of MLA Handbook, 8th edition)

- Start the list on a new page with the page number in the upper right-hand corner, .5" from the top, flush with the right margin.
- Center the title (Works Cited) 1" from the top of the page.
- Double-space the entire list, including between the title and first entry.
- Start the first line of each entry flush with the left margin, and indent subsequent lines of the entry .5" from the left margin.
- Use the abbreviations listed in section 1.6 of the handbook where appropriate.
- Sort the entries in alphabetical order (see section 2.7 for details).

Changes from the 7th edition:

- Include "vol.", "no.", and "p."/"pp." when you include the volume, number, and page numbers.
- Do not include the place of publication.
- Do not include a medium of publication (Print, Web, Film, DVD, etc.).
- Date of access for online sources is optional but can be important for pages likely to change.
- Include the URL of online publications, but omit http://; use a permalink or DOI, if available.
- Do not use abbreviations for missing information such as date and page numbers.
